OVERVIEW

Feed standards for dog and cat, pig, poultry and cattle feeds, drafted by members of the National Technical Committee, and overseen by the Standards Association of Zimbabwe, have been widely circulated for comment before they are finalised. This process was started many years ago and it is anticipated that the new Standards will be finalised in the next few months.

The Division of Veterinary Technical Services in the Department of Veterinary Services have reviewed their fees for laboratory testing, inspections by Veterinary Public Health (VPH) and registration charges, VPH import/export inspections, testing, certification and issue of permits. Zimbabwe Herd Book

Pedigree breeders have finalised their herd lists for all stud animals and staff are updating their records on BreedPlan, the registry software programme. While registration of new animals, sales and transfers occur throughout the year, the annual review of herd lists also assists breeders with their own on-farm record keeping. Pedigree registrations of Brahman cattle are the highest, followed by Boran and Tuli. Pedigree Boer and Kalahari Red Goats and Dorper sheep are also registered.
